Proactive

Milestones

Initiative

- The ability to take the first step or make a decision without being prompted or instructed by others.

Resources

- Assets or capabilities that can be used to support something.
- "The company provided its employees with resources for professional development, including paid training programs and access to industry publications."

Referrals

- A person who recommends someone for a job, a service, or a company based on their skill set or reputation/respect garnered in the field.
- "Her former boss gave her a referral to another company, highlighting her strengths and contributions during her time in previously held positions."

Online presence

- The existence and visibility of a person, organization, or product on the Internet, through websites, social media channels, and other online communication platforms.
- "A strong online presence is critical in today's digital era, as potential employers often use social media accounts and professional networking platforms to research candidates."

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Expertise

- A high level of skill, knowledge, or experience in a particular field.
- "His expertise in marketing helped him lead his team to develop a successful advertising campaign."

Countermeasures

- Actions or techniques used to prevent or mitigate negative outcomes or risks.
- "The company implemented countermeasures to prevent data breaches and protect the security of their customers' personal information."

Satisfaction

- A feeling of pleasure or contentment derived from achieving a desired outcome or fulfilling a need.
- "The success of the project brought satisfaction to everyone involved, and they celebrated with a team dinner."

Anticipate

- To think or predict that something will happen and take action accordingly.
- "The team anticipated that the project would be completed in four months and set the milestones according to the timeline."
